# **Racial Affinity Groups**

This year the EGPS Annual Conference is incorporating Racial Affinity Groups, which will gather for 45-minutes on both Saturday and Sunday of conference weekend. We offer these groups in response to past experiences in Large Group and in the Conference as a whole, during which members expressed a desire and need for safe places to process their reactions. The inclusion of Racial Affinity Groups is consistent with EGPS' mission of anti-racism, inclusion, and the pursuit of equity.

We offer Racial Affinity Groups in recognition of the deep and on-going impact of race and particularly of the systemic racism of white supremacy on the lived experiences of conference attendees. We recognize that identities are multi-faceted and intersectional and that there are other dimensions of oppression that interact with racial oppression in complex ways and encourage attendees to bring their full selves and their intersectional identities into whichever groups they choose to attend.
