2022 Global Meeting on Law and Society



2022 Theme

Rage, Reckoning & Remedy

In these times, a shifting world is upon us—one that demands a close examination of equality, freedom, and humanity. At the center of that critical examination are issues of race, colonialism, and the legacies of slavery. As communities demand an end to racial inequality, the urgency to grapple with the pains and realities of the past comes front and center.

While the history of slavery has been robustly centered in the United States, in reality, these global enterprises flourished the world over, creating human subjects and chattel of men, women, and children, in North America, South America, the Caribbean, the Pacific Islands, Australasia and other lands. Portuguese ships alone carried millions of Africans into slavery over a period of four centuries from the mid-15th century.

Even after slavery's formal abolition, colonization became a rebranded form of human subjugation and subordination, seen vividly through the lenses of Europe's imperial reaches into Asia and Africa, a precursor for modern forms of slavery and the predatory ways in which modern societies exploit the non-human environment. The violence and exploitation that resulted remains a point of social, legal, cultural and even ecological trauma today.

At the 2022 Global Law and Society meeting in Portugal, we will place these urgent issues at the forefront of our engagement, drawing upon law, history, art, sociology, psychology, politics and culture to give serious attention to the past, while drawing lessons and hope for the future.

Plenary sessions will take up these concerns and center important research and conversations about dismantling and reimagining social, legal, and political structures that perpetuate and instantiate racism and inequality in society. That is, even though slavery and colonialism are tragic common bonds and legacies in the modern world, this meeting will unpack how to move forward to forge more equitable societies.

Welcome to Lisbon

It is our honor to welcome you to the 2022 Global Meeting on Law and Society in Lisbon! Every five years, the Law and Society Association (LSA) partners with other socio-legal associations to host a meeting in a global setting. This meeting brings together the Law and Society community from across the world. We come together at a critical time in our world where a global pandemic continues to expose institutional and infrastructural inequalities. To adapt, we offer this meeting in person and through virtual space. We gather to engage in critical thought and robust dialogue, to examine the paths of law, society, and culture, to recenter the relevance and value of empirical analysis to citizenry and public policy, and to celebrate the scholarly accomplishments of our colleagues.

We welcome members of more than 30 associations and networks, including our co-sponsors: the Law and Society Association (LSA), the Research Committee on the Sociology of Law (RCSL), the Africa Law and Society Network (ALSN), the Asian Law and Society Association (ALSA), the Law and Society Association of Australia and New Zealand (LSAANZ), the Brazilian Association for the Sociology of Law (ABraSD), the Brazilian Network on Empirical Legal Studies (REED), the Canadian Law and Society Association (CLSA), the Japanese Association of Sociology of Law (JASL), the Section for Sociology of Law and Justice of the Portuguese Association of Sociology, and the Socio-Legal Studies Association (SLSA). We also welcome the graduate students who will be taking part in this historic meeting and in our pre-conference Graduate Student and Early Career Workshop.

We thank our hosts, ISCTE University Institute of Lisbon and its Rector, Maria de Lurdes Rodrigues, and the Local Arrangements Committee led by Susana Santos and Pierre Guibentif, for their support in bringing this meeting to fruition. Thank you also to the Law and Society Executive Office, who have been the engine room driving this conference, the CRN and IRC Chairs, and to our wonderful colleagues on the Lisbon Program Committee, all of whom worked tirelessly to put together the Program you see here.

And most of all, we welcome and thank each of you and appreciate the journey you have taken to join us.

Our Aims

We gather in Lisbon, during the time of pandemic, in the wake of racial uprising, and in a moment marked by greater concern for women's rights, LGBTQ equality, and disability justice. Indeed, this year's theme, Rage, Reckoning, and Remedy refers to the need to inquire and understand the past in order to make sense of the present and move more equitably into the future. As Co-Chairs, we believe these times demand a close examination of equality, freedom, and humanity. At the center of that critical examination are issues of race, colonialism, and the legacies of slavery. As communities call for an end to racial inequality, the urgency to grapple with the pains and realities of the past comes front and center.

While the history of slavery has been robustly centered in the United States, these global enterprises flourished the world over, creating human subjects and chattel of men, women, and children, in North America, South America, the Caribbean, the Pacific Islands, Australasia and other lands. Even after slavery's formal abolition, colonization became a rebranded form of human subjugation and subordination, seen vividly through the lenses of Europe's imperial reaches into Asia and Africa, a precursor for modern forms of slavery and for the predatory ways in which modern societies exploit the non-human environment. The violence and exploitation that resulted remains a point of social, legal, cultural, and ecological trauma today.

These realities have been brought into stark relief by the challenging times we continue to face, not the least of which include the continuing threat of the global COVID-19 pandemic. At Lisbon, we hope you will place these urgent issues at the forefront of our engagement, drawing upon law, history, art, sociology, psychology, politics, and culture to give serious attention to the past, while drawing lessons and hope for the future.

We aim to take up these concerns and center important research and conversations about dismantling and reimagining social, legal, and political structures that perpetuate and instantiate racism and inequality in society. That is, even

though slavery and colonialism are tragic common bonds and legacies in the modern world, with this meeting we will unpack how to move forward to forge more equitable societies.

Sessions, Roundtables, Book Panels, and Plenaries

Our program for Lisbon is formidable. We have over 4,500 participants in this year's meeting. It engages social, legal, cultural, economic, and ecological issues crucial to every country and the world as a whole. Panels include important discussions examining equality, freedom, and humanity, including critical examination of issues related to race, colonialism, and the legacies of slavery. Most of the sessions take the familiar form of panels. The panel chair introduces panelists, who present their papers. A discussant comments on these papers; and the audience has their say as well. Some sessions will be crowded; some will have smaller audiences. All of them will try to leave room for questions and observations from the audience.

There will also be roundtable sessions in which scholars exchange ideas about a particular subject. Author Meets Reader sessions focus on recently published books on law and society. The meeting includes three Plenary Sessions, led by a slate of first-rate law and society scholars from all over the world, that take up intellectual and policy developments in our field and relating to the theme. Finally, professional development panels concern such matters as research publication, public outreach, and research methodology. Please be sure to check out the Global Café, where representatives of socio-legal associations from all around the world will discuss Collaborations, Positioning, Journals, and the Next Generation.

There are many ways to be involved and continue the conversation beyond the panels and plenaries, and beyond this conference. The LSA has created Collaborative Research Networks (CRNs), which cluster together groups of scholars who have interests and methodological approaches in common (listed at https://www.lawandsociety.org/collaborative-research-networks/). Many CRNs have open business meetings listed in the program, which is another way to connect with them. International Research Collaboratives (IRCs, https://www.lawandsociety.org/international-research-collaboratives/) are also sponsoring conference panels. IRCs are temporary groups of scholars, formed to pursue a specific scholarly project, with participation of global South scholars funded by a grant from the National Science Foundation to the LSA. We have 41 IRC's present at this conference! RCSL has incubated Working Groups, which revolve around a common theme, which will be represented in Lisbon (https://www.lawandsociety.org/working-groups). Language and Accessibility

This is our second multi-lingual conference, after Mexico City in 2017. Papers have been submitted in English and Portuguese, given our situation at the heart of the Portuguese-speaking world, which includes Angola, Brazil, Cape Verde, East Timor, Guinea Bissau, Macau, Mozambique, Portugal, & São Tomé and Príncipe. A number of sessions, including the Portuguese-language plenary panel on July 14, will be translated simultaneously into English. With the idea of expanding the language choice being to broaden access to the global socio-legal community, we have also accepted and hope you will engage with panels in other languages, while recognizing that English remains the lingua franca of our discipline and a common language for many of us.

In light of the ongoing global COVID-19 pandemic, Lisbon will be the first hybrid LSA conference. The hybrid format allows for those who cannot travel to Lisbon to have the opportunity to attend aspects of the conference virtually. This includes making some on-site activities and presentations available to virtual participants, and also facilitating completely virtual options for scholars who cannot attend in-person. Of the nearly 960 sessions, 249 sessions will be held online, in addition to the in-person events that will be made available to virtual participants.

Other Conference Events and Activities

In addition to the regular conference program, there are also a number of special events. On Wednesday, Maria de Lurdes Rodrigues (Rector of ISCTE), Michele Goodwin (University of California, Irvine, Co-Chair of the Program Committee), and Susana Santos (ISCTE-CIES_ISCTE, Co-Chair of the Local Arrangements Committee) will offer welcoming words ahead of the first plenary, which will be followed by a Welcome Reception at the Pateo da Gale. Many associations and networks will be holding members' meetings, and on Thursday evening some will be hosting drinks, dinner and dancing around the City. Check the program, and look out for social media and other notices to connect with them.

Lisbon is, of course, one of the great cities of the world and a cultural, legal, and political hub. The Local Arrangements Committee has organized tours and special events, which are listed in the program.

We hope that you will have a great experience of this conference wherever you are in the world. For those in Lisbon, we urge you to take advantage of the many wonderful aspects of this great city, make use of the opportunities to meet new people, and broaden your understanding of the global links between law and society. Again, our most sincere welcome to all of you.



Arms and the People is the most famous film of the Portuguese Revolution. Shot in the week between the 25th of April and the 1st of May, 1974, it brings together the mass demonstrations and the speeches of Mário Soares and Álvaro Cunhal, the release of the political prisoners, and the street interviews made by the Brazilian filmmaker Glauber Rocha. Directed by the Collective of Workers of the Cinematographic Activity, it is a priceless historical document, made on the fly by several Portuguese filmmakers and technicians. An inescapable part of European militant cinema, Arms and the *People* is also a manifest on the relation between cinema and politics, not only as a mere diffuser of the events but mainly as an active participant of the revolutionary act.



Ghosts of an Empire explores the colonial imagination of Portuguese cinema since the beginning of the 20th century. The documentaries and fictions that carry the imperialist project are contrasted with contemporary films and gazes.

Seven Portuguese filmmakers - Fernando Matos Silva, João Botelho, Margarida Cardoso, Hugo Vieira da Silva, Ivo M. Ferreira, Manuel Faria de Almeida, Joaquim Lopes Barbosa - open the chests of colonial cinematographic memory and dialogue with two actors, the São Toméan Ângelo Torres and the Angolan Orlando Sérgio. They examine the real, re-invented or repressed past that haunts memories: the myths of discovery, the imperial fiction, the colonial epic factory, the masks of violent domination. José Manuel Costa, director of the Cinemateca Portuguesa, and Maria do Carmo Piçarra, researcher, bring historical perspectives on certain aspects of the production.

Ghosts of an Empire brings together heterogeneous cinematographic fragments and various points of view, and shows the variations and evolutions of the glances, especially on "the other", formerly called "colonized", yet perennial fellow citizen of our humanity.

By playing on counterpoints, echoes, contrasts between situations, images, dialogues, music, the film weaves a web of imaginations and attitudes, memories, and emotions. And it questions the persistence of ghosts in the present and the future of cinema.

The Law and Society's International Research Collaboratives (IRCs) are groups of law and social science researchers organized to undertake specific sociolegal research projects with a global reach. The objective is to strengthen law and social science scholarship generally and especially that of U.S. scholars by connecting them with theoretical, methodological, and policy discussions taking place among law and social science researchers world-wide.

The IRCs were selected in 2015 and have convened at the joint meeting of the Law and Society Association (LSA) and the Research Committee on the Sociology of Law (RCSL) in Mexico City in 2017, and at the Law and Society Association Annual Meeting in DC in 2019.

The RCSL was initially conceived as a forum, largely informal, for specialists from all over the world to compare and exchange ideas. Since the late Sixties, it has established various permanent working groups as a means to promote its research activity more vigorously. Its membership has grown from about two dozen scholars in 1962 to more than 450 in 2002. On December 23, 1988, the RCSL signed an agreement with the government of the Basque Country, giving birth to the Oñati International Institute for the Sociology of Law.

Types of Sessions Offered

Participant-submitted session proposals tend to follow these formats:

Paper Sessions: These are traditional scholarly paper panels organized around a common theme.

Roundtable Session: A roundtable is a discussion-centered session organized around a common theme and does not have papers presented. These are the most flexible format offered at the Meeting and could include visual performances, films, and other innovative formats.

Author Meets Reader (AMR) Session: An AMR is a session in which discussion is focused on one or more recently published scholarly books. The session includes the author, a session chair, and readers who discuss the publication from their point of view.

New Books in the Field Session: Five or more new books in a field are briefly presented and discussed.

In addition, the Program Committee also organizes:

Plenary Sessions: These panels are based on the theme of the Meeting and are scheduled with a no other sessions running concurrently.

Professional Development Panels: These are created to enhance career development and opportunities within the field of socio-legal studies.

Local Arrangement Committee Panels: These are created by the Local Arrangements Committee.

Abbreviation Key

In addition to "AMR," the following abbreviations are used in the Session Schedule:

CRN – Collaborative Research Network – LSA has 55 CRNs that provide an opportunity for interdisciplinary study. Scholars often experience difficulty finding and maintaining contact with those who have similar interests at other institutions. The Law and Society Association exists to overcome these barriers and to enable the growth and integration of the social study of law. As part of this effort the Association has encouraged the creation of CRNs to organize thematic sessions for the annual meetings and develop cross-disciplinary/cross-national research projects. **IRC – International Research Collaborative** – Are groups of law and social science researchers that undertake sociolegal research projects with a global reach. These collaborations strengthen law and social science scholarship, especially among U.S. scholars, by connecting them with theoretical, methodological, and policy discussions taking place among researchers around the world. IRCs are a key component of the intellectual life of LSA, and have been instrumental in fostering and strengthening international and interdisciplinary scholarly networks.

Law & Society Association Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy

1. LSA Commitment to a Culture Free of Discrimination and Harassment

The Law & Society Association (LSA) is committed to providing a safe, inclusive, and welcoming environment for all participants at its conferences, events, and virtual meeting places. LSA therefore strives toward a culture free of discrimination and harassment, especially discrimination or harassment on the basis of actual or perceived sex, gender identity, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, socioeconomic status, age, religion, national origin, citizenship status, criminal record, veteran status, or their intersection. Discrimination against or harassment of colleagues, students, or other conference participants undermines professional norms that promote scholarly exchange and professional development. Such discrimination or harassment also undermines equal access to and enjoyment of the scholarly activities of LSA. "Participant" in this policy refers to anyone present at LSA meetings or events, including staff, contractors, vendors, exhibitors, venue staff, LSA members, and all other attendees. The LSA policy is intentionally broader than most antidiscrimination laws to create an environment conducive to scholarly exchange.

One of the central tenets of law and society scholarship is that policies alone rarely guarantee social change. Therefore, we couple our anti-discrimination and anti-harassment policy with a request that all LSA participants proactively help to establish a culture of respect in which all participants feel welcome and included. Such a culture will not only help to ensure that all participants feel welcome but also provide the best possible environment for intellectual exchange and professional development. Specifically, we request that all participants be aware of situations, actions, or language that may have the effect of making others feel unwelcome or disrespected and, if necessary, take action when such situations, action, or language are observed. We encourage all participants to be reflective about their language and to strive to ensure that their biases, both explicit and implicit, are not contributing to an environment that may be perceived by some as hostile to their group.

LSA provides ombuds and intake officers [*Please see contact information at the end of the policy*] to assist any conference participant who witnesses or experiences harassment or discrimination. In the sections below, we define discrimination and harassment, we offer suggestions for helping to create a culture free of discrimination and harassment, and we elaborate procedures for contacting an ombuds and for filing a complaint.

2. The LSA Anti-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy

LSA prohibits discrimination or harassment, including but not limited to discrimination or harassment on the basis of actual or perceived sex, gender identity, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, socioeconomic status, age, religion, national origin, citizenship status, criminal record, veteran status, or their intersection. This policy does not prohibit affirmative action, which in some situations may be necessary to avoid discrimination. LSA encourages anyone who experiences harassment or discrimination to use one of the complaint options outlined in this policy.

3. What is Discrimination?

Discrimination includes *unequal treatment* of participants on the basis of actual or perceived sex, gender, gender identity, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, socioeconomic status, age, religion, national origin, citizenship status, criminal record, or veteran status, or their intersection. Discrimination also includes actions or comments that have an *unequal effect* on participants on the basis of actual or perceived sex, gender, gender identity, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, socioeconomic status, age, religion, national origin, legal status, criminal record, or veteran status, or their intersection. Discrimination also includes harassment, as defined below, on the basis of actual or perceived sex, gender, gender, gender, gender, gender, gender, identity, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, socioeconomic status, or perceived sex, gender, gender, identity, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, socioeconomic status, or perceived sex, gender, gender, gender identity, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, socioeconomic status, age, religion, national origin, citizenship status, criminal record, veteran status, or their intersection.

4. What is Harassment?

Harassment includes all actions or comments that are reasonably experienced as intimidating, harassing, abusive, derogatory, demeaning, or consistently marginalizing. Harassment also includes unwanted touching, harassing photography or recording, sustained disruption of talks or other events, and the real or implied threat of physical harm. Harassment is uniquely harmful when actions or comments are related to actual or perceived sex, gender identity, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, socioeconomic status, age, religion, national origin, legal status, criminal record, veteran status, or their intersection. Harassment based on gender, which has the effect of making someone feel demeaned or marking them as different in a negative way on the basis of their gender can constitute discrimination because of sex, and can but need not also include sexual harassment as defined below.

5. What is Sexual Harassment?

Sexual harassment is a form of harassment. Sexual harassment includes severe or pervasive unwelcome solicitation of physical or emotional intimacy or touching, as well as severe or pervasive commentary or nonverbal conduct that is sexual in nature, regardless of the gender of the complainant. To be sexual harassment, the harassment need not involve sexual desire.

6. What is the Standard for Evaluating Claims of Discrimination or Harassment?

Under this policy, discrimination and harassment are defined not by the intent of the perpetrator but rather from the perspective of a reasonable person in the complainant's position, using a preponderance of the evidence standard.

7. What to Do to Help to Create a Culture Free of Discrimination and Harassment

All participants can play a role in creating an environment free of harassment and discrimination by following the norms of professional respect that help to promote honest intellectual exchange and quality scholarship. Participants should be proactive about mitigating harm to other conference participants. Participants can be proactive by: (1) recognizing that the power differences inherent in academia and in society generally can inhibit less powerful parties such as students and junior scholars from voicing their objections to offensive comments or behavior; (2) recognizing that harassment may take the form of subtle forms of conduct, including unintentional conduct, that are harmful to groups that lack societal power; (3) taking affirmative steps to include others in conference conversations or activities; and (4) being an active bystander if you observe potential harm to another participant. If necessary, contact an ombuds via email or at the cell phone number that is provided following document to link you with the ombuds on duty or, if someone appears to be in imminent physical danger, contact security personnel.

8. What to Do if You Experience Discrimination or Harassment at any LSA Event

LSA provides two places to start to receive help regarding any type of discrimination or harassment prohibited by LSA policy. First, the ombuds of the LSA are available for informal confidential consultation about a wide range of concerns, including but not limited to discrimination or harassment. Second, the Discrimination or Harassment Complaint Procedure provides a more formal option for reporting and seeking formal resolution of incidents of discrimination or harassment. Each option is described separately in the next sections. The quickest way to report an incident and to get help addressing it, especially during an LSA meeting, is to contact an ombuds. However, participants are free to file a complaint without contacting an ombuds. The LSA ombuds may be contacted via email or at the cell phone number provided at each meeting and an intake officer for the Complaint Committee may be contacted via email at <u>intakeofficer@lawandsociety.org</u>. Contact info for the intake officers is also provided following this document.

9. The Role of the Ombuds

The ombuds play no role in LSA's formal complaint procedure, but can offer confidential guidance about what constitutes discrimination or harassment. The ombuds can also explain LSA options for reporting discrimination or harassment and outline other avenues for pursuing

such a complaint, such as state or local government, human rights or law enforcement agencies, the federal Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, or the U.S. Office for Civil Rights. If appropriate and if the complainant requests it, the ombuds may attempt conciliation. The ombuds cannot provide legal advice, but can offer support and guidance even if no further action is taken.

LSA recommends that the complainant first consult with the ombuds for clarification about the entire range of their options. This consultation is confidential and the details of such a conversation will not be reported to any administrator, officer, or committee of the LSA, except as required by applicable law. At all times, the role of the ombuds is entirely independent of any complaint you may decide to pursue through the following LSA complaint procedure. The ombuds will not keep any written records of complaints or consultations. Ombuds can be reached via email that will be provided and through cell phone numbers provided for each meeting or by asking for assistance from conference personnel. In the event that the ombuds is involved in or has a relationship with any party to the dispute, the ombuds will be recused after contacting another ombuds to address the issue.

10. The Discrimination or Harassment Complaint Procedure

Any participant in LSA may file a complaint regarding an incident that occurred at an annual meeting of the LSA or any other LSA event within the past two years. A complaint may be filed by contacting the intake officer for the Discrimination or Harassment Complaint Committee via email or at a cell phone number that is provided following this document. You can also send an email to <u>intakeofficer@lawandsociety.org</u>. In the event that any member of the Committee has a prior relationship to any party involved in the complaint or is named in the complaint, that person will be recused from participation. In most cases, complaints should be in writing but a complainant may relate a complaint orally.

The chair of the Complaint Committee will contact the individual whose conduct is at issue in order to hear his or her perspective. The Complaint Committee will also conduct an appropriate investigation, which includes interviewing both parties and any witnesses to the incident identified by either party. The Committee will write a brief report stating its finding and determination, and the factual basis for the decision. The Committee will also allow the respondent and complainant to respond to the report in writing. In reaching conclusions about whether harassment or discrimination has occurred, LSA will not look to U.S. federal case law because much law and society scholarship indicates that federal case law tends to find that only the most egregious of acts constitute harassment and tends to overlook meaningful evidence in assessing discrimination. Instead, the Committee will consider whether the discriminatory or harassing conduct would have negatively affected the experience or experiences at LSA for a reasonable person in the complainant's position, using a preponderance of the evidence standard. The Committee will then, if appropriate, determine sanctions. When a participant is

found to have engaged in discrimination or harassment, the possible sanctions for that person are:

- 1. Issuing a warning to cease the discriminatory or harassing behavior and retaining a record of that warning in case of future violations;
- 2. Requiring the respondent to appear before the Complaint Committee and LSA President to learn about the consequences of their behavior and about likely consequences of similar behavior in the future;
- 3. Notifying the respondent's home institution of the violation;
- 4. Termination of current LSA conference participation and any LSA responsibilities or appointments held;
- 5. Barring the person from assuming any future governance positions within LSA;
- 6. Barring the person from participating in future LSA conferences or events; and/or
- 7. Revoking LSA membership

The Chair of the Complaint Committee will notify both parties of the Complaint Committee's decision. Should either party wish to appeal, the Executive Committee of the LSA and the Chair of the Complaint Committee will hear the appeal. Any party who is involved in the dispute or closely related to a party involved in the dispute would be recused. Decisions of the ad-hoc appeals committee are final.

11. Recordkeeping

The LSA's Executive Officer will prepare two annual reports. The first report will contain general information about the number and types of complaints received. No names will be included in this report. The report will be provided to the LSA board and will be available by request to any LSA member.

The second report will describe each complaint and action taken, with all names included. This report will be held as a confidential record in the LSA's national office and may be consulted only by members of the LSA Executive Committee and members of the Complaint Committee in the course of their official duties, or as otherwise required by law

12. Policy Review

LSA should conduct climate surveys of its membership and of conference attendees every 2 years to determine the prevalence of discrimination and harassment. LSA will review both climate survey data and complaint records every 2 years to identify any weaknesses in the policy and will make changes to bring LSA closer to having an environment free of discrimination and harassment.

A LSA, portanto, luta por uma cultura livre de discriminação e assédio, especialmente contra discriminação ou assédio com base no sexo, real ou suposto, identidade de género, raça, etnia, orientação sexual, deficiência, estatuto socioeconómico, idade, religião, nacionalidade, condição de cidadania, antecedentes criminais e militares, ou na interseção de algumas destas características. A discriminação ou assédio de colegas, estudantes ou outros/as participantes da conferência prejudica a efetividade das normas profissionais que promovem o intercâmbio académico e o desenvolvimento profissional. Essa discriminação ou assédio também prejudica a igualdade de acesso e aproveitamento das atividades académicas da LSA. "Participante", nesta política, refere-se a qualquer pessoa presente em reuniões ou eventos da LSA, incluindo funcionários, contratados, fornecedores, expositores, funcionários locais, membros da LSA e todas/os as/os outras/os participantes. A política da LSA é intencionalmente mais ampla do que está previsto na maioria das leis antidiscriminação e tem a finalidade de criar um ambiente profício ao intercâmbio acadêmico.

Um dos postulados centrais dos estudos sobre direito e sociedade é que as políticas, por si mesmas, raramente garantem a mudança social. Portanto, associamos a nossa política antidiscriminação e anti assédio a um pedido para que todos/as os/as participantes da LSA ajudem proactivamente a estabelecer uma cultura de respeito e inclusão. Essa cultura não só ajudará a garantir que todas as pessoas se sintam bem-vindas, mas também proporcionará o melhor ambiente possível para o intercâmbio intelectual e o desenvolvimento profissional. Especificamente, solicitamos que todos/as os/as participantes tomem atenção às situações, ações ou linguagem que possam ter efeitos indesejados ou desrespeitadores, e tomem medidas necessárias quando tais situações ocorrerem. Incentivamos os/as participantes a refletirem sobre sua linguagem e a esforçarem-se para garantir que seus preconceitos, tanto os explícitos como os implícitos, não contribuam para um ambiente que possa ser percebido por alguns como hostil ao seu grupo.

A LSA dispõe de um gabinete onde qualquer participante se pode dirigir para pedir ajuda caso testemunhe ou sofra de assédio ou qualquer forma de discriminação. Nas seções abaixo, definimos discriminação e assédio, oferecemos sugestões para ajudar a criar uma cultura livre de discriminação e assédio, e apresentamos os procedimentos para entrar em contato com um/a dos/as provedores/as e para registar uma reclamação.

2. A política antidiscriminação e anti assédio da LSA

A LSA proíbe qualquer forma de discriminação ou assédio, incluindo, entre outros, discriminação ou assédio com base no sexo, real ou suposto, identidade de género, raça, etnia, orientação sexual, deficiência, estatuto socioeconómico, idade, religião, nacionalidade, condição de cidadania, antecedentes criminais e militares, ou na interseção de algumas destas características. Esta política não proíbe ações assertivas que em algumas situações possam ser

necessárias para evitar discriminação. A LSA incentiva qualquer pessoa que sofra assédio ou discriminação a usar uma das opções de reclamação descritas nesta política.

3. O que é discriminação?

A discriminação inclui tratamento desigual, ações ou comentários e/ou assédio (conforme definido abaixo) das/os participantes com base no sexo, real ou suposto, identidade de género, raça, etnia, orientação sexual, deficiência, estatuto socioeconómico, idade, religião, nacionalidade, condição de cidadania, antecedentes criminais e militares, ou na interseção de algumas destas características.

4. O que é assédio?

Assédio inclui todas as ações ou comentários que são experimentados e possam ser razoavelmente entendidos como intimidadores, assediadores, abusivos, depreciativos, humilhantes ou consistentemente marginalizantes. O assédio também inclui toques indesejados, fotografia ou gravação para fins de assédio, interrupção insidiosa de conversas ou outras interações sociais e a ameaça direta ou implícita de dano físico. O assédio é especialmente danoso quando as ações ou comentários se relacionam com o sexo, real ou suposto, identidade de género, raça, etnia, orientação sexual, deficiência, estatuto socioeconómico, idade, religião, nacionalidade, condição de cidadania, antecedentes criminais e militares, ou na interseção de algumas destas características. O assédio com base no género, que tem o efeito de fazer alguém sentir-se humilhado/a ou marcá-lo/a como negativamente diferente com base em seu género, pode constituir discriminação por causa do sexo e pode, embora não necessariamente, incluir o assédio sexual conforme definido abaixo.

5. O que é assédio sexual?

O assédio sexual é uma forma de assédio e inclui solicitação indesejada grave ou incidiosa de intimidade física ou emocional ou toque, bem como comentários graves ou incidiosos, e conduta não verbal de natureza sexual, independentemente do sexo do/a denunciante. Para ser assédio sexual, não precisa envolver desejo sexual.

6. Qual é o critério de avaliação de reclamações de discriminação ou assédio?

De acordo com esta política, a discriminação e o assédio são definidos não pela intenção do/a agressor/a, mas sim pela perspetiva razoável de uma pessoa na posição de denunciante, baseada em evidências.

7. O que fazer para ajudar a criar uma cultura livre de discriminação e assédio

Todos os participantes podem desempenhar um papel ativo na criação de um ambiente livre de assédio e discriminação, seguindo as normas de respeito profissional. Os/As participantes devem ser proativos quanto à mitigação de danos a outros/as participantes da conferência, especificamente: (1) reconhecendo que as diferenças de poder inerentes à academia e à sociedade em geral podem inibir pessoas menos poderosas, como estudantes e académicos júniores, de expressar as suas objeções a comentários ou comportamentos ofensivos; (2) reconhecer que o assédio pode assumir formas subtis de conduta, incluindo conduta não intencional, que são prejudiciais a grupos que não têm poder social; (3) tomar medidas

assertivas para incluir outras pessoas nas conversas ou atividades da conferência; e (4) prestar um apoio ativo se observar dano potencial para outro/a participante.

8. O que fazer se sofrer discriminação ou assédio em qualquer evento da LSA

A LSA disponibiliza duas formas de apoio em situação de discriminação ou assédio. Em primeiro lugar, na figura dos/as Provedores/as da LSA que estão disponíveis para consultas informais confidenciais sobre uma ampla gama de preocupações, incluindo, entre outras, discriminação e assédio. Em segundo lugar, o Procedimento de Queixa de Discriminação ou Assédio que oferece uma opção para quem deseje uma resolução mais formal de incidentes de discriminação ou assédio. Cada opção é descrita separadamente nas próximas seções. A maneira mais rápida de relatar um incidente e obter ajuda, especialmente durante uma reunião da LSA, é entrar em contato com o Gabinete do Provedor, através do e-mail atintakeofficer@lawandsociety.org. No entanto, os/as participantes são livres para registar uma reclamação sem entrar em contato com o referido Gabinete.

9. O papel do provedor

Os/as provedores/as não desempenham nenhum papel no procedimento formal de reclamação da LSA, mas podem oferecer orientação confidencial sobre o que constitui discriminação ou assédio. Os/as provedores/as também podem explicar as opções da LSA para reportar discriminação ou assédio e apresentar outros caminhos para a concretizar a reclamação, como apresentando-a ao governo de estado ou à autarquia, a agências de direitos humanos ou à polícia. Se for o caso e se a/o reclamante assim o solicitar, as/os provedoras/es poderão tentar a arbitragem. Não é suposto darem aconselhamento jurídico, mas podem oferecer apoio e orientação mesmo que nenhuma outra ação seja levada a cabo.

A LSA recomenda que a/o reclamante primeiro consulte o/a provedora para esclarecimentos sobre toda a gama de opções. Esta consulta é confidencial, exceto se for exigido pela lei aplicável. Em todos os momentos, o papel do/a provedor/a é totalmente independente de qualquer reclamação que a/o queixosa/o decida avançar por meio do procedimento de reclamação da LSA. As/os provedoras/es não manterão registos escritos de reclamações ou consultas. O/a provedor/a pode ser contatado/a através do e-mail que será fornecido. Caso o/a provedor/a esteja envolvido/a ou tenha relacionamento com qualquer parte, esse/a provedor/a será recusado/a é será contatado outro/a provedor/a para tratar do assunto.

10. O procedimento de queixa de discriminação ou assédio

Qualquer participante da LSA pode registar uma reclamação sobre um incidente ocorrido numa reunião anual ou qualquer outro evento da LSA nos últimos dois anos. Uma reclamação pode ser feita entrando em contato, por email, com a/o responsável do Comité de Queixas de Discriminação ou Assédio para admissionofficer@lawandsociety.org. Caso algum membro do Comité tenha um relacionamento anterior com qualquer uma das partes envolvidas na reclamação, a participação dessa pessoa no processo será recusada. É desejável que as reclamações sejam feitas por escrito, mas o/a reclamante pode fazê-lo oralmente.

A/o presidente do Comité de Reclamações conduzirá uma investigação apropriada, que incluirá entrevistar ambas as partes e quaisquer testemunhas do incidente identificadas por qualquer uma das partes. O Comité redigirá um breve relatório informando sobre as constatações, determinações e a base factual para a decisão. O Comité também permitirá que a/o respondente

e a/o reclamante respondam ao relatório por escrito. Se se concluir que houve a ocorrência de uma situação de assédio ou discriminação, a LSA não seguirá a jurisprudência federal dos EUA porque há estudos que indicam que a jurisprudência federal tende a indicar que são apenas os atos mais flagrantes que constituem assédio, ignorando evidências significativas para avaliar a discriminação. Em vez disso, o Comité ponderará se a conduta discriminatória ou de assédio afeta negativamente a experiência ou experiências na LSA para a pessoa na posição de reclamante, usando os critérios de evidência. O Comité determinará as sanções mais apropriadas ao caso, a saber:

1. Emitir um aviso para cessar o comportamento discriminatório ou de assédio e manter um registo desse aviso em caso de futuras violações;

2. Exigir que o/a respondente compareça perante o Comité de Reclamações e o Presidente da LSA para conhecer as consequências de seu comportamento e as prováveis consequências de comportamento semelhante no futuro;

3. Notificar a instituição de origem da pessoa envolvida sobre a violação de que está a ser acusado/a;

4. Fim da participação na conferência da LSA e quaisquer responsabilidades ou compromissos assumidos pela LSA;

5. Impedir que a pessoa assuma quaisquer cargos futuros de governança dentro da LSA;

6. Impedir a pessoa de participar de futuras conferências ou eventos da LSA; e/ou

7. Revogação da condição de membro da LSA.

O/a Presidente do Comité de Reclamações notificará ambas as partes da decisão. Caso qualquer uma das partes deseje apelar, o Comité Executivo da LSA e a/o Presidente do Comité de Reclamações ouvirão o recurso. Qualquer parte envolvida na disputa ou intimamente relacionada a uma parte envolvida na disputa será dispensada. As decisões do Comité *ad-hoc* de recurso são finais.

11. Manutenção de registos

O/a Diretor Executivo da LSA preparará dois relatórios anuais. O primeiro relatório conterá informações gerais sobre o número e os tipos de reclamações recebidas, garantindo os princípios éticos da confidencialidade, anonimato e projetação de dados. O relatório será fornecido ao conselho da LSA e estará disponível mediante solicitação a qualquer membro da LSA.

O segundo relatório descreverá cada reclamação e ação tomada, com todos os nomes incluídos. Este relatório será mantido como um registo confidencial no escritório nacional da LSA e pode ser consultado apenas por membros do Comité Executivo da LSA e membros do Comité de Reclamações no exercício de suas funções oficiais, ou conforme exigido por lei.

12. Revisão da política

A LSA deve realizar inquéritos sobre o ambiente social entre membros e participantes da conferência bianual para determinar a prevalência de discriminação e assédio. A LSA analisará os dados destes estudos e dos registos de reclamações, a cada 2 anos, para identificar quaisquer pontos fracos na política e orientar as mudanças entendidas como necessárias para aproximar a LSA de um ambiente livre de discriminação e assédio.






